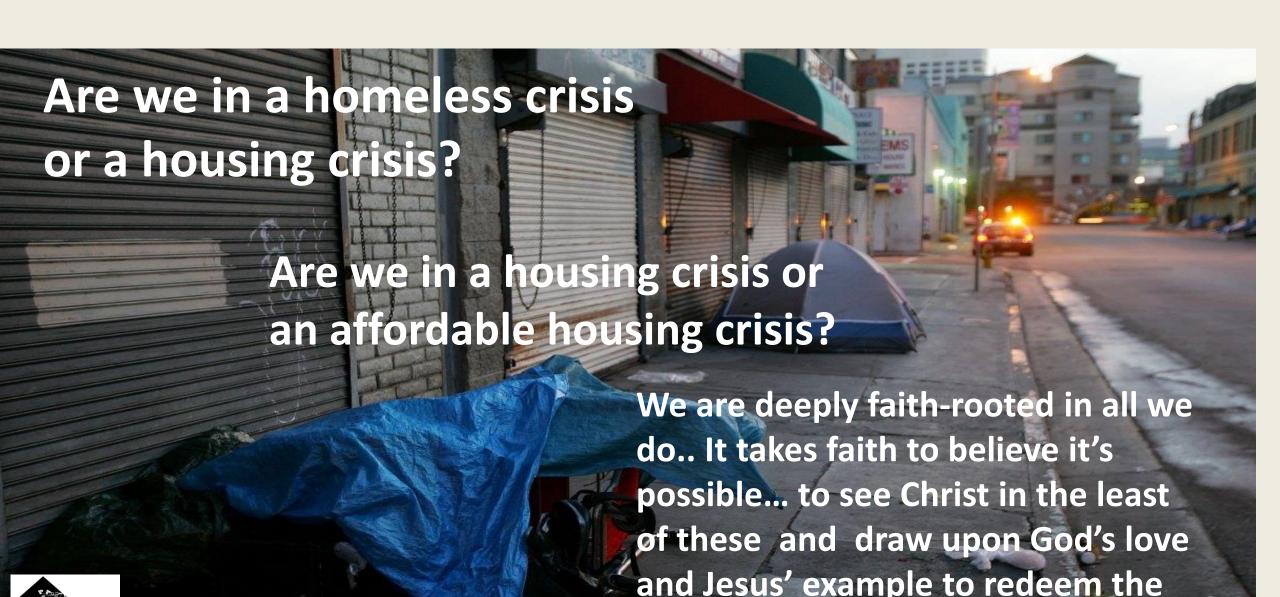
We have six subcommittees:

Some ideas to consider:

Do you feel ready to write a brief letter to your City Council rep? To have other pastors you know sign it?

Are you open to sharing this with other pastors you know in your district?

Are you willing to call your City Council rep? Pastoral group offer brief Presentations.

What will it take?

If there are ten calls and/or ten letters from each church to their City Council reps
And 50 pastors submit a public comment when it comes to the city council, this is highly likely to be passed.

Sample letter

Dear	

We appreciate your leadership in our city. One of the biggest obstacles to building affordable housing is a lack of sites. A significant number of churches in Pasadena desire to have affordable housing on their excess land. Yet, most church land is not properly zoned to allow this use. To make it possible for any church in Pasadena that feels led to provide affordable housing on their property we are asking the city to make what is called an "overlay" zone. This would apply to any church when 50% of the units to be build would be affordable. The overlay zone would:

- Allow roughly a 100% density increase (i.e. a property zoned at 16 units per acre would increase to 32 units per acre).
- Allow church property that is zoned "commercial" to also become residential
- Allow church property that is zoned "public" to also become residential.

Thanks for your consideration. Can I count on you to help churches address the housing crisis?
